## You have been scheduled to complete the NLN Basic Proficiency in Medication Administration Assessment

- All Experienced and Newly Licensed RNs will take the Adult version of the assessment.
- This nationally validated and reliable testing tool measures the knowledge and abilities necessary for registered nurses to safely administer medications to a general adult population.
- The test is computer based, 60 multiple-choice questions, with a 75 minute time allowance. The test includes three categories of questions:
  - Calculations
  - Principles of Medication Administration
  - Drug Effects
- Three subset scores and an overall score are provided to the test taker upon completion of the assessment.
- An overall score of 80% is required for successful completion of the assessment and prior to the RN administering medications to patients.
  - If an overall score of 80% is not attained, opportunity to retake the assessment will be provided.
  - Calculators may be utilized during the assessment.
