II. POLICY:

It is the institutional policy of Lehigh Valley Health Network that all osteopathic resident physicians must take the COMLEX Step III exam during their PGY-1 year of training prior to being offered a PGY-2 position.

Resident physicians who have not successfully passed the COMLEX Step III exam by February 28 of their PGY-2 year of training will not be offered a PGY-3 position in a training program at Lehigh Valley Health Network.

Individual residency programs may have specific requirements for COMLEX Step III which must be adhered to in addition to the institutional requirement.

Exceptions to this policy can be made by the DIO and DME jointly for extraordinary circumstances and every effort to take COMLEX Step III at the earliest possible time must be made*.

COMLEX Step III - Addendum

***COVID-19 PANDEMIC EXCEPTION:**

This GME policy will be temporarily waived in accordance with the following statement issued by the PA Department of State on April 7, 2020:

“Due to the closure of testing centers during the COVID-19 disaster declaration, Graduate Medical Trainees (GMT) may not be able to take the standardized United States Medical Licensing Exam (USMLE).

This exam – in conjunction with the determination of their residency program director – decides whether a medical resident should advance into their next year of training.

The Department of State and State Board of Medicine have requested, and the Governor has granted, a temporary waiver allowing a facility’s resident program director to determine

which GMTs have gained the skills and fulfilled the requirements necessary to advance in their postgraduate year (PGY) training in the absence of the USMLE.

The following requirements are temporarily waived:

- A GMT must pass Step 2 of the USMLE before entry into PGY2
- A GMT must pass Step 2 plus Step 3 of the USMLE before entry into PGY3

The resident program director has authority over and accountability for the operation of the residency program. The program director ensures that the residents achieve the learning objectives of the program through supervised patient care and clinical teaching. Therefore, it falls on the program director to determine whether a resident has fulfilled the requirements of their PGY year. These waivers will allow the GMT to advance in their training, as their skills allow, and take the USMLE when the exam is available. Submission of exam results will be required if a licensee later renews at a higher level and upon application for an unrestricted license.”
