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

AP versus Dual Enrollment; What's the Difference?

AP Classes

Scores based on standardized exam Taught in high school classrooms Exam score dictates credit being awarded

Dual Enrollment Classes

Grade based on course grade Taught on college campus in state-of-the-art facilities College credit on official transcript Exposure to college environment

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Rising seniors in a participating Schuylkill County School district with:

- One year of high school biology and chemistry with a grade of 3.0 or better
- An excellent attendance record
- A scheduled or completed trigonometry class with a grade of 3.0 or higher
- Written recommendations from a high school guidance counselor and one chemistry or biology teacher

Students must also:

- Meet academic prerequisites for Penn State University courses
- Successfully complete an interview

WHAT'S REQUIRED?

Students who have met all of the requirements and are accepted into the program must:

- Present a health certification signed by a health care professional (physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner; a chiropractor will not be accepted)
- Be fully vaccinated including annual flu and COVID vaccine
- Complete tuberculosis (TB) questionnaire an 2-step TB testing, as required for shadowing
- Complete required orientation paperwork
- Pay initial deposit fee
- Commit to the entire, school-year long program
